Summary Statement:

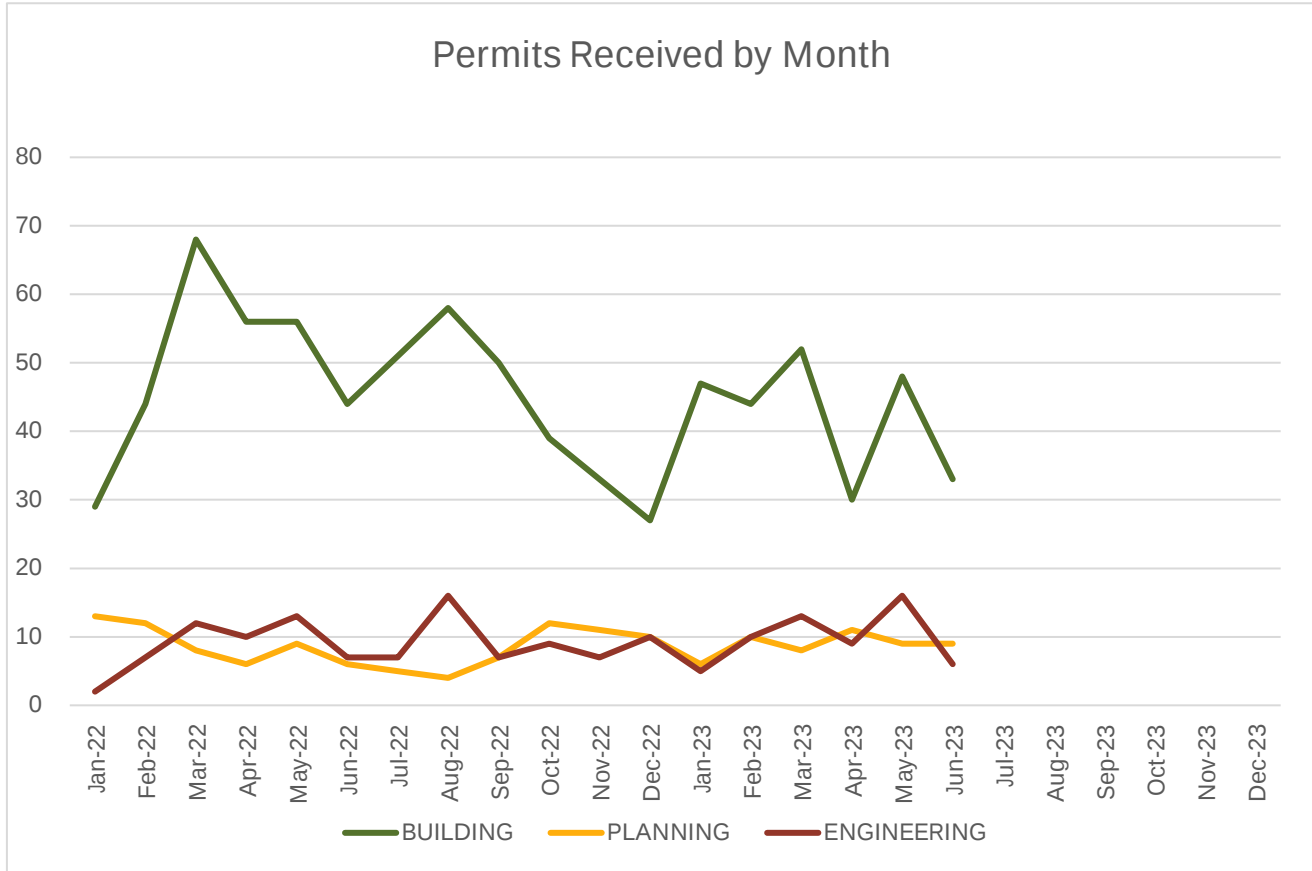

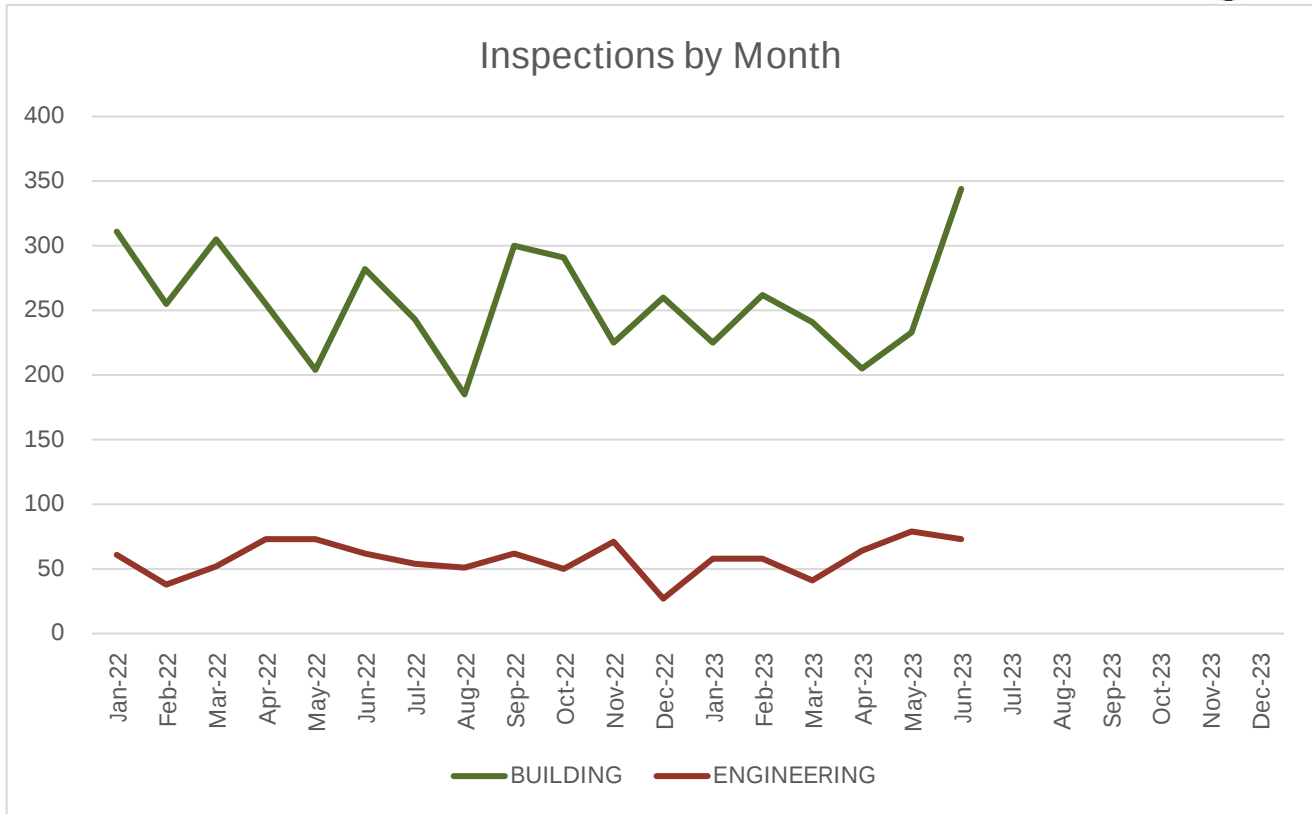

Summary Statement:

The City Council previously adopted term limits for the Mayor and Councilmembers, as set forth in Edgewood Municipal Code ("EMC") Chapter 2.10. The EMC provides that no person may serve on the City Council or in the office of Mayor for more than two consecutive four-year terms. Questions were recently raised as to whether an individual can run for a different council position after their two terms are up, or if they can run again after a break in service. This agenda item includes draft code amendments to clarify these sections.

2.10.010 Limiting councilmembers to serving two consecutive four-year terms.

No person shall be allowed to serve in any position on the city council for more than two consecutive four-year terms; provided, that this prohibition shall not disqualify any person now serving on the city council from completing the term of office that he or she has been elected to serve as of the effective date of the ordinance codified in this chapter. This prohibition shall not disqualify a person from serving again on the city council after a break in service of at least two years.

2.10.015 Term limits for office of mayor.

No person shall be allowed to serve in the office of mayor for more than two consecutive four-year terms; provided, this prohibition shall not disqualify any person serving as mayor as of the effective date of the ordinance codified in this section from completing the term of office that he or she has been elected to serve or from running for, and serving if so elected, one additional four-year term. This prohibition shall not disqualify a person from serving again in the office of mayor after a break in service as mayor of at least four years, or from serving on the city council at least two years after serving as mayor.

Summary Statement:

Under RCW 39.34.030 local government agencies may use another agency's active contracts to purchase products, services or public works. This process is known as "piggybacking" This process allows agencies to save time and to obtain better prices and terms than we might be able to find on our own. We currently use this process to buy off state contracts as well as several multi-jurisdictional contracts.

Washington School Information Processing Cooperative (WSIPC) was founded in 1967 when ten school districts united to share software, hardware and centralized technology support costs. As they grew, they expanded from just school districts but now also serve cities and counties, with more than twenty cities in Washington state being members.

Edgewood would like leverage some of the services that have already been bid by WSIPC. To do this we must sign an Inter Local Agreement (ILA)

Interlocal Agreement Between Washington School Information Processing Cooperative And City of Edgewood

The interlocal agreement is hereby entered into by and between City of Edgewood and the Washington School Information Processing Cooperative, Everett WA (hereinafter WSIPC).

WHEREAS, The Interlocal Cooperative Act, as amended, and codified in Chapter 39.34 of the Revised Code of Washington provides for the interlocal cooperation between governmental agencies; and

WHEREAS, both parties are required to make certain purchases by formal advertisement and bid process, which is a time consuming and expensive process; and it is in the public interest to cooperate in the combination of bidding requirements to obtain the most favorable bid for each party where it is in their mutual interest; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to utilize each other's contracts when it is in their mutual interest;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Purpose:** The purpose of this agreement is to authorize the acquisition of goods and services under contracts where a price is extended by bidders to other governmental agencies.
2. **Scope.** This agreement shall allow the following activities: purchase or acquisition of supplies, materials, equipment, and services by City of Edgewood under contracts made by WSIPC where provision has been provided in such contracts for other agencies to avail themselves of goods and services offered under the contract when agreed to in advance, in writing.
3. **Duration of Agreement-Termination.** This agreement shall remain in force until canceled by either party by written notice to the other party.
4. **Right to Contract Independent Action Preserved.** WSIPC does not accept responsibility or liability for the performance of any vendor used by the purchasing agency as a result of this Agreement. Each party also reserves the right to contract independently for the acquisition of goods and services and shall be independently responsible for the ownership, holding and disposal of property acquired for such party under this agreement.
5. **Compliance with Legal Requirements.** Each party accepts responsibility for compliance with federal, state, and local laws and regulations including, in particular, bidding requirements applicable to its acquisition of goods and services.

6. Financing. The method of financing of payment shall be through budgeted funds or other available funds of the party for whose use the property is actually acquired. Each party accepts no responsibility for the payment of the acquisition process of any goods or services intended for use by the other party.
7. Filing. Executed copies of this agreement shall be filed as required by Section 39.34.040 of the Revised Code of Washington prior to this agreement becoming effective.
8. Interlocal Cooperation Disclosure. Each party may insert in its solicitation for goods and services any provision disclosing that other authorized governmental agencies may also wish to procure the goods or services being offered to the party and allowing the bidder the opportunity of extending its bid to those other agencies at the same bid price, terms, and conditions.
9. Non-Delegation/Non-Assignment. Neither party may delegate the performance of any contractual obligation, hereunder to a third party, unless mutually agreed on in writing. Neither party may assign this agreement without the written consent of the other party.
10. Hold Harmless. Each party shall be liable and responsible for the consequences of any negligence or wrongful act or failure to act on the part of itself and its employees. Neither party assumes responsibility for the other party for the consequences of any act or admission of the other party of any person, firms, or corporation not a party to this agreement.
11. Severability. Any provision of this agreement, which is prohibited or unenforceable, shall be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability, without invalidating the remaining provisions or affecting the validity or reinforcement of such provisions.

The city receives a substantial portion of it's sustained revenue to provide ongoing services from it's three main tax based sources, property tax, sales tax and utility tax. Law enforcement, street repair and maintenance, parks and trail maintenance, and general government services are funded by these sources. Real Estate Excise Taxes and Law Enforcement Infraction revenue can be used to supplement the cost of these activities, but are "one-time" fees and when they dry up, the only source of revenue available are from taxes.

RESOLUTION NO. 23-0XXX

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD, PIERCE COUNTY, WASHINGTON, PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 7, 2023, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE STATE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE SAME DATE, OF A PROPOSITION TO LEVY REGULAR PROPERTY TAXES IN EXCESS OF THE LIMITATIONS OF CHAPTER 84.55 RCW; SETTING FORTH THE TEXT OF THE BALLOT PROPOSITION; DIRECTING CITY OFFICIALS TO TAKE NECESSARY ACTIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 84.55.050, the City of Edgewood may levy regular property taxes in any calendar year in excess of limitations specified in chapter 84.55 RCW when such levy has been authorized by a proposition approved by a majority of the voters of the City voting on the proposition at a general or special election within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined the current level of funding is not adequate to meet community demands for law enforcement services and additional funding is necessary to secure a solution that would provide stable funding; and

WHEREAS, in order to improve the current level of law enforcement and roads maintenance services being provided to the residents of the City of Edgewood, it is deemed necessary that the City increase its regular property tax levy rate to \$1.40 per \$1,000 of assessed value for collection in 2024 and thereafter to use the resulting levy amount for the purpose of computing the limitations for subsequent levies as allowed by Chapter 84.55 RCW;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Call for Election. The Edgewood City Council requests that Pierce County Auditor hold an election concurrent with the November 7, 2023, general election, in the manner provided by law, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City of Edgewood, with such additions, deletions or modifications as may be required, the ballot proposition set forth in Section 2.

Section 2. Official Ballot Proposition. The Edgewood City Clerk is hereby directed to certify, no later than August 1, 2023, to Pierce County Auditor, the following proposition:

CITY OF EDGEWOOD -- Proposition 1
Law Enforcement and Roads
Maintenance Levy

The Edgewood City Council adopted Resolution No. 23-XXXX, authorizing a proposition to fund law enforcement and roads maintenance. The proposition increases the regular property tax levy to \$1.40000000000 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, for collection in 2024. The levy limits for 2025-2029 will use a limit factor of 106%. A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD, PIERCE COUNTY, WASHINGTON, PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 7, 2023, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE STATE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE SAME DATE, OF A PROPOSITION TO LEVY REGULAR PROPERTY TAXES IN EXCESS OF THE LIMITATIONS OF CHAPTER 84.55 RCW; SETTING FORTH THE TEXT OF THE BALLOT PROPOSITION; DIRECTING CITY OFFICIALS TO TAKE NECESSARY ACTIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 84.55.050, the City of Edgewood may levy regular property taxes in any calendar year in excess of limitations specified in chapter 84.55 RCW when such levy has been authorized by a proposition approved by a majority of the voters of the City voting on the proposition at a general or special election within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined the current level of funding is not adequate to meet community demands for law enforcement services and additional funding is necessary to secure a solution that would provide stable funding; and
