1 CALL TO ORDER

2 COUNCIL BUSINESS

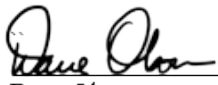
- A.** Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Council Sub-Committee Update
Deputy Mayor Tomin and Councilmembers Buckley and Southard briefly shared their experience from the listening session held earlier at the Mountain View Community Center.
- B.** Economic Development Advisory Board (EDAB) Updates
Community Development Director Metzler shared the development reports with the Council, and discussed the conversations they had with a local small business owner in Edgewood.
- C.** Annual CIP Update
Staff presented the draft 2025–2030 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) update and discussed timelines, project priorities, and funding sources with Council.
- D.** Food Truck Pilot Program
Staff and the Economic Development Advisory Board (EDAB) presented the proposed Food Truck Pilot Program for Council discussion. The program aims to simplify permitting and support local food vendors by testing revised regulations for the 2026 season. Council reviewed the draft guidelines and will consider a resolution for formal adoption at a future meeting.
- E.** 2026 Preliminary Budget
Finance Director Goraya presented the proposed 2026 Annual Budget, prepared in compliance with RCW 35A.33, for Council review and consideration. Two public hearings will be held to receive community input before the Council considers final adoption of the budget ordinance.
- F.** Car Tab Fees
The recurring discussion regarding the City's Transportation Benefit District charges (Car Tab fee) focused on the importance of maintaining a sustainable funding source to meet increasing street operations and maintenance costs, considering inflation, reduced real estate tax revenues, and unchanged state fuel tax allocations.

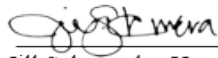
